- 1972                      Graduated at the Faculty of Dramatic Arts in Belgrade, Department of Theatrical Direction.
- 1978                      He staged the play “Sporting Life” at the Belgrade Drama Theatre, the text of which was co-written with Vojislav Kajganić. After that, he wrote two monodramas, “Prodajem razbivenog fiću” [For Sale: One Demolished Fića] and “Isповest klovna Dragoljuba” [The Confessions of Dragoljub, a Clown].
- 1991                      He wrote the play “Kaskader” [Stunt Performer] which he subsequently directed at the Belgrade Drama Theatre. Mr Petković has authored 10 plays, which have been performed in Belgrade theatres and throughout Serbia, such as “Gran pri” [Grand Prix], “Legija časti” [Legion of Honor], “Kaskader” [Stunt Performer] and “Cvetovi zla” [Les Fleurs du Mal], which was filmed under the title “Albatros” [Albatross]. Mr Petković wrote the screenplay for the films “Beogradski fantom” [The Belgrade Phantom] and “Zaboravljeni Gran pri” [The Forgotten Grand Prix].
- Since 1994              Mr Petković is the founder and director of the Automobile Museum, which features the chamber stage “Moderna garaža”.  
Mr Petković is the vice-president of the Association of Playwrights, the president of the Association of Museums of Science and Technology and a member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences of Serbia.
- 2000                      Mr Petković was the recipient of the Nušić Award and
